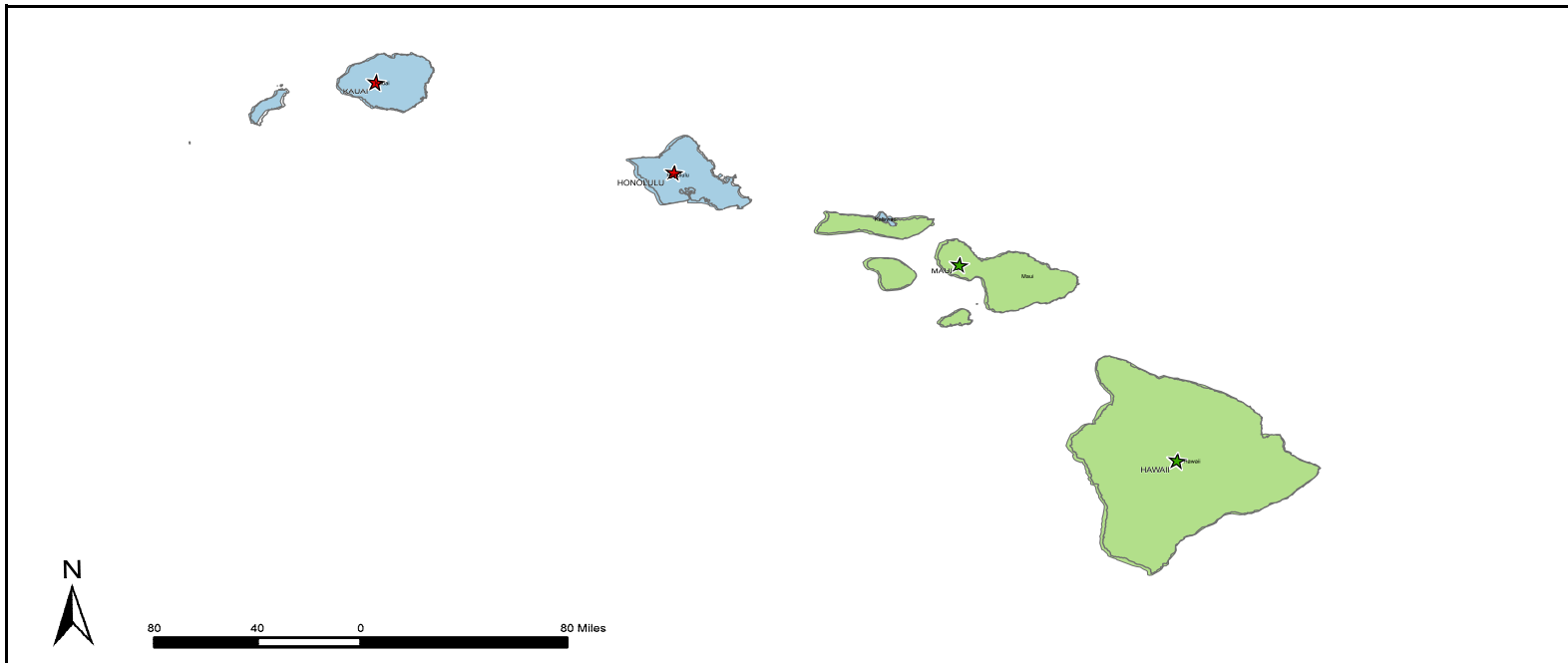

As of May 2017, 4 communities in Hawaii participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. Of these communities, 2 (or 50%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).

Of the top 4 Hawaii communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 2 participate in the CRS. The remaining 2 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.

Benefits of Joining the CRS

* Activities credited by the CRS provide direct benefits to the community, including enhanced public safety, reduction in flood damage and environmental protection.

* Residents are reminded that the community is working to protect them from flood losses.

* Public information activities will build a knowledgeable constituency interested in supporting and improving flood protection measures.

* Money stays in the community instead of being spent on insurance premiums.
