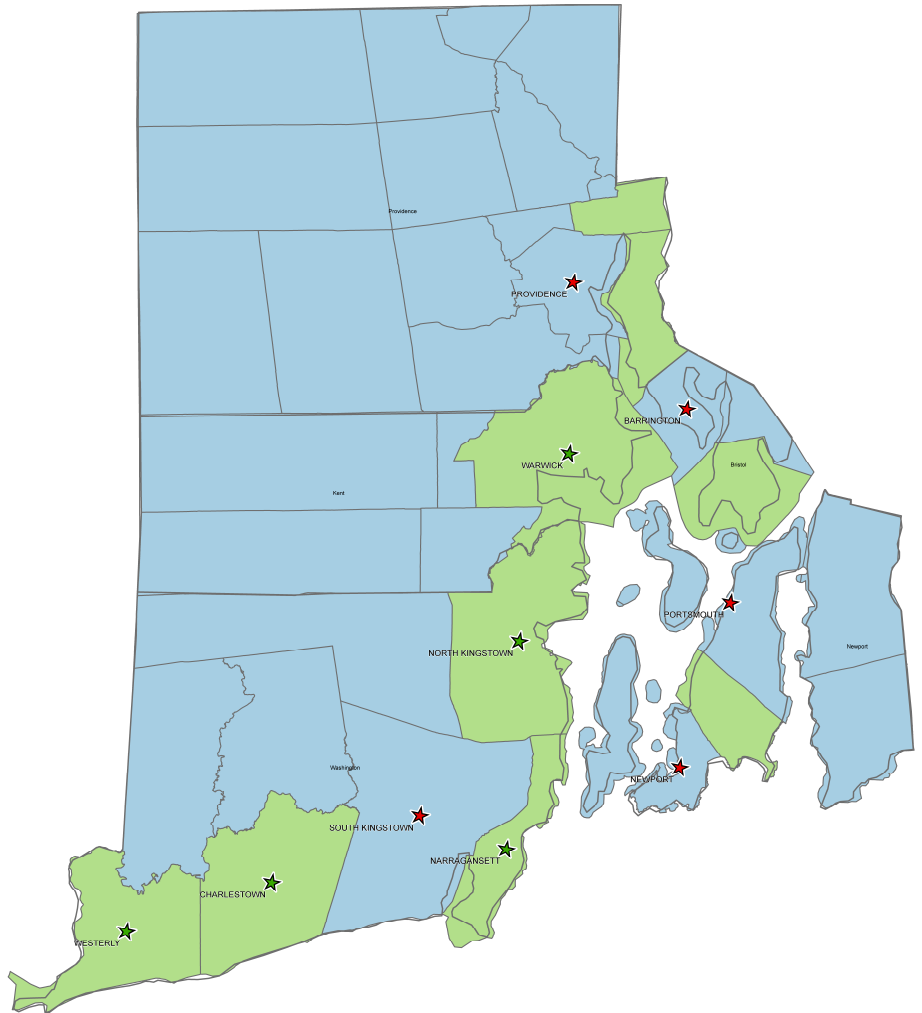

NOTES:

As of May 2017, 40 communities in Rhode Island participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. Of these communities, 9 (or 23%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).

Of the top 10 Rhode Island communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 5 participate in the CRS. The remaining 5 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.

Benefits of Joining the CRS

- * Activities credited by the CRS provide direct benefits to the community, including enhanced public safety, reduction in flood damage and environmental protection.*
- * Residents are reminded that the community is working to protect them from flood losses.*
- * Public information activities will build a knowledgeable constituency interested in supporting and improving flood protection measures.*
- * Money stays in the community instead of being spent on insurance premiums.*
