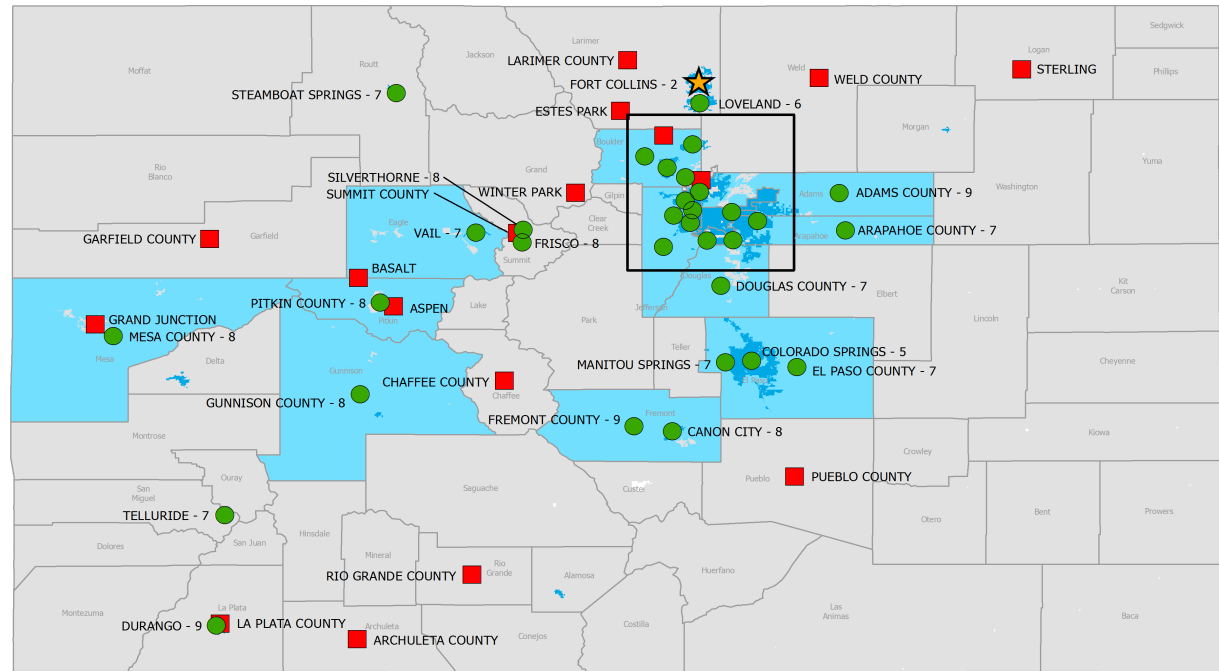

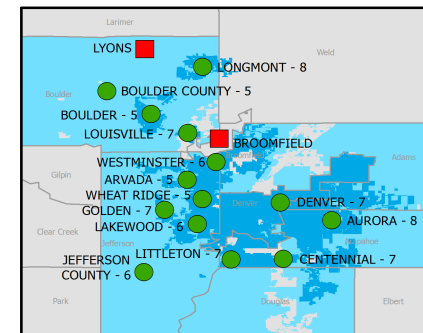

 As of October 2017, 251 communities in Colorado participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).
 Of these communities, 47 (or 19%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).
 Of the top 50 Colorado communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 33 participate in the CRS.
 The remaining 17 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
