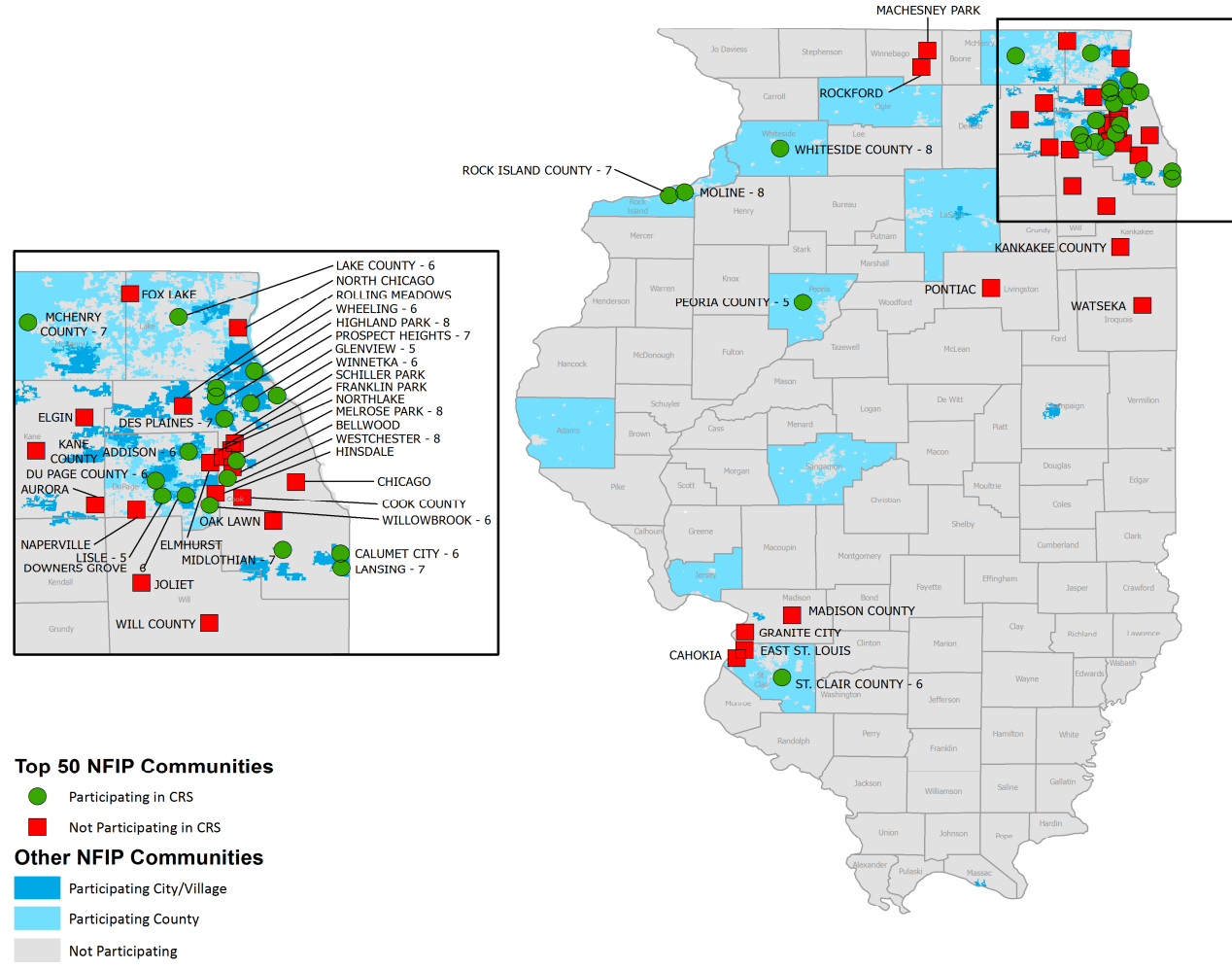

 As of October 2018, 886 communities in Illinois participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).
 Of these communities, 65 (or 7%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).
 Of the top 50 Illinois communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 23 participate in the CRS.
 The remaining 27 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
