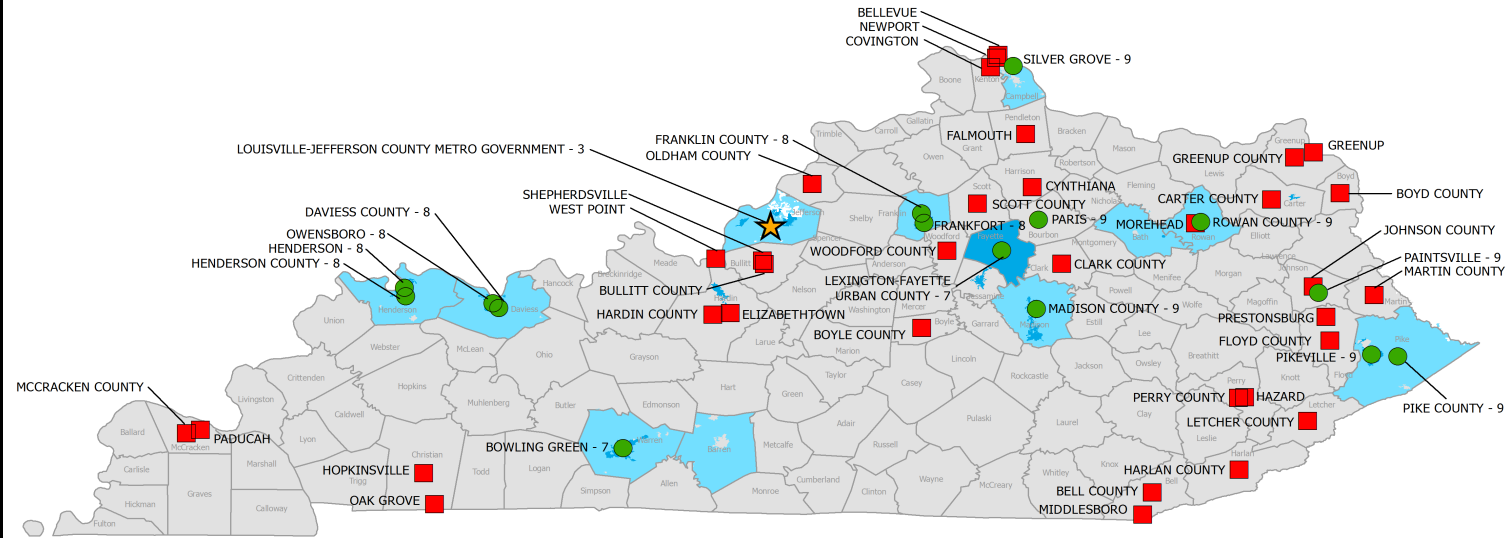

 The remaining 34 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
