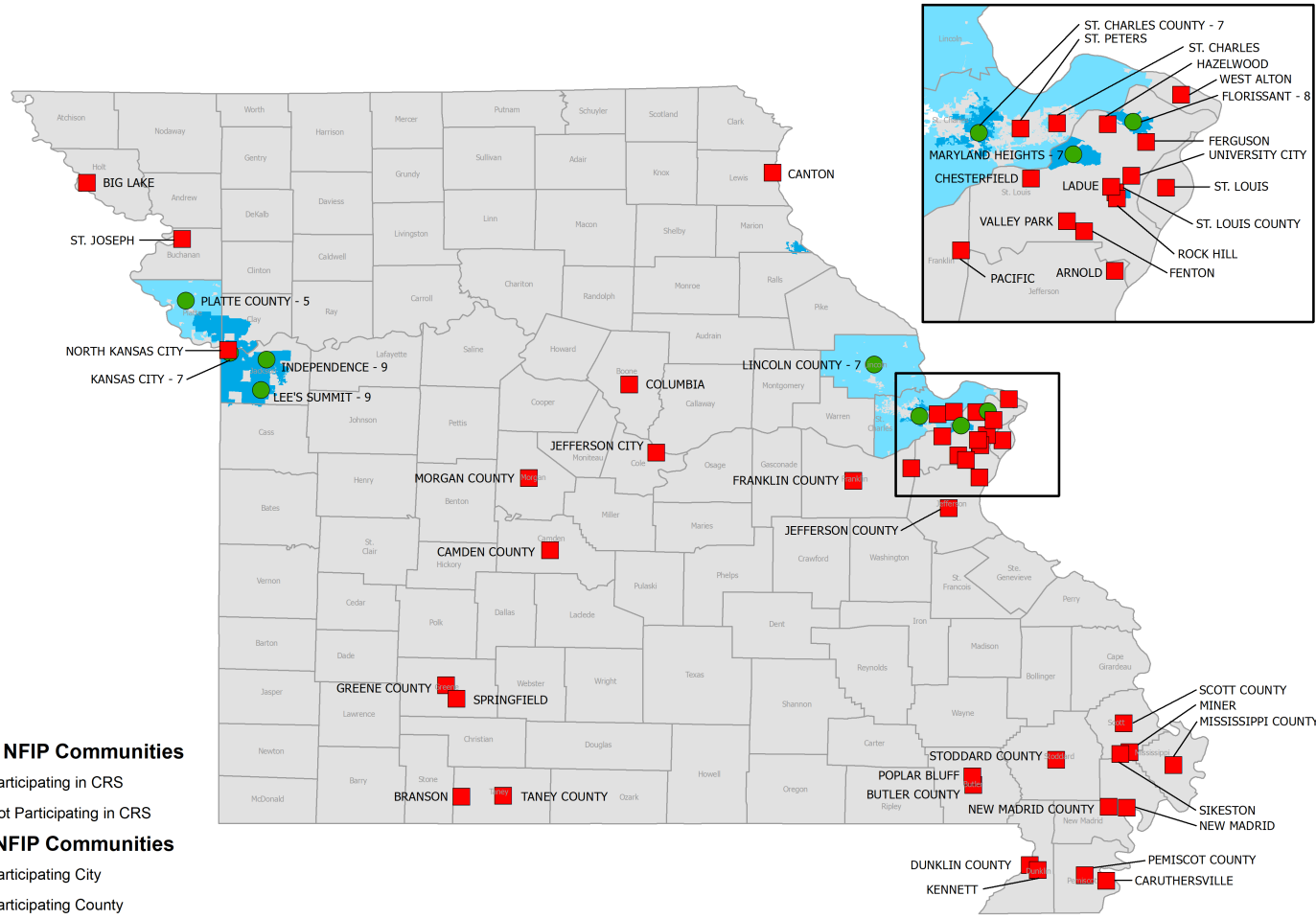

As of August 2020, 677 communities in Missouri participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).  
Of these communities, 12 (or 2%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).  
Of the top 50 Missouri communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 8 participate in the CRS.  
The remaining 42 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.



### Benefits of Joining the CRS

- \* Activities credited by the CRS provide direct benefits to the community, including enhanced public safety, reduction in flood damage and environmental protection.
- \* Residents are reminded that the community is working to protect them from flood losses.
- \* Public information activities will build a knowledgeable constituency interested in supporting and improving flood protection measures.
- \* Money stays in the community instead of being spent on insurance premiums.
