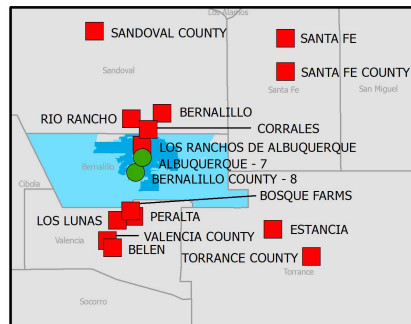

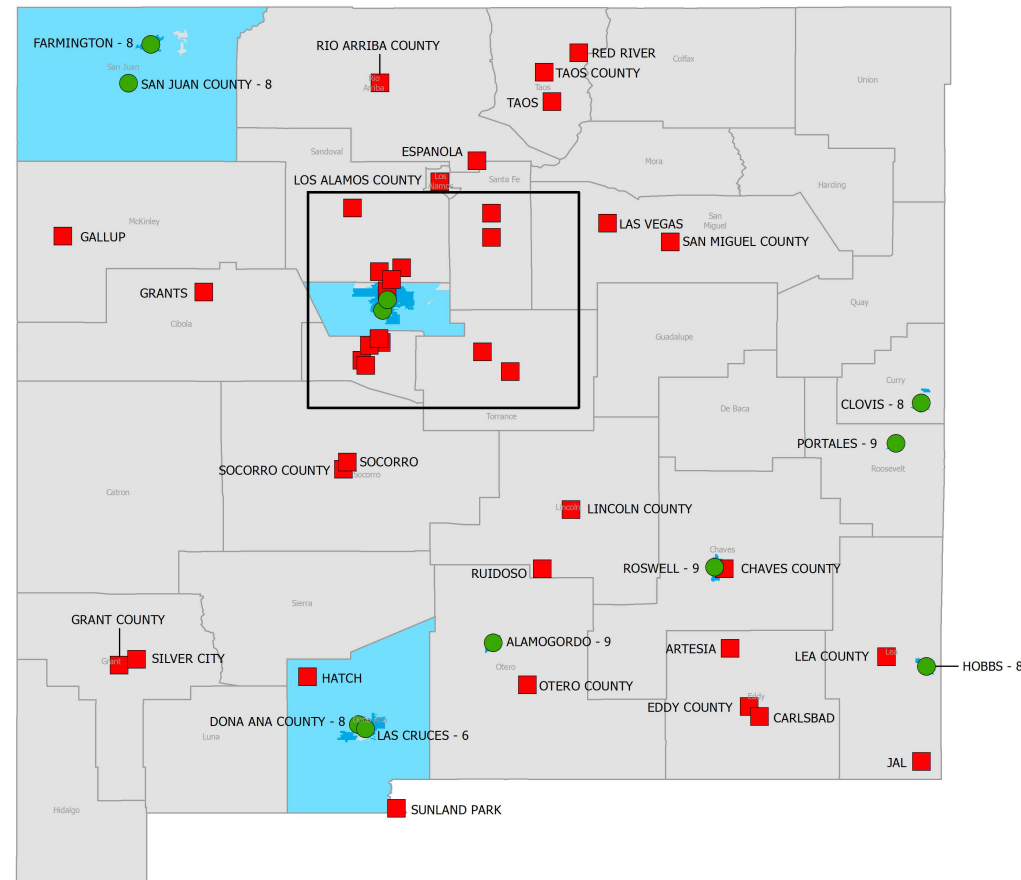

 As of August 2019, 104 communities in New Mexico participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Of these communities, 11 (or 11%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).
 Of the top 50 New Mexico communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 11 participate in the CRS. The remaining 39 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
