

As of July 2021, 400 communities in Tennessee participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

Of these communities, 13 (or 3%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS).

Of the top 50 Tennessee communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 8 participate in the CRS.

The remaining 42 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
