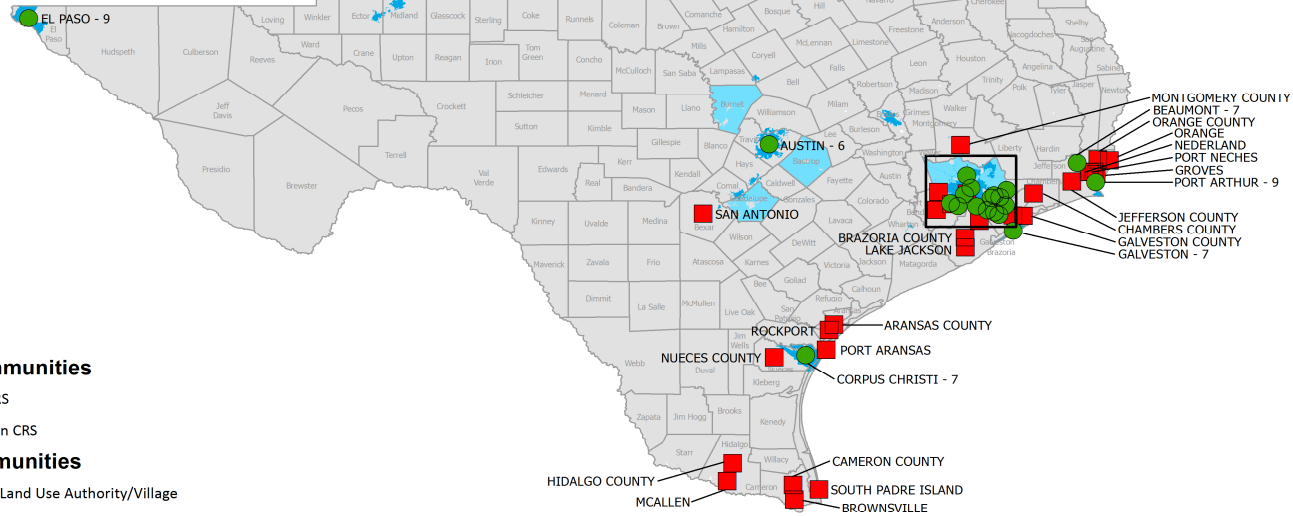
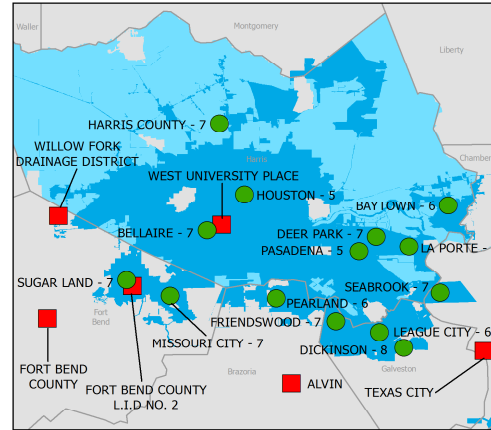

 Of the top 50 Texas communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 22 participate in the CRS.
 The remaining 28 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
