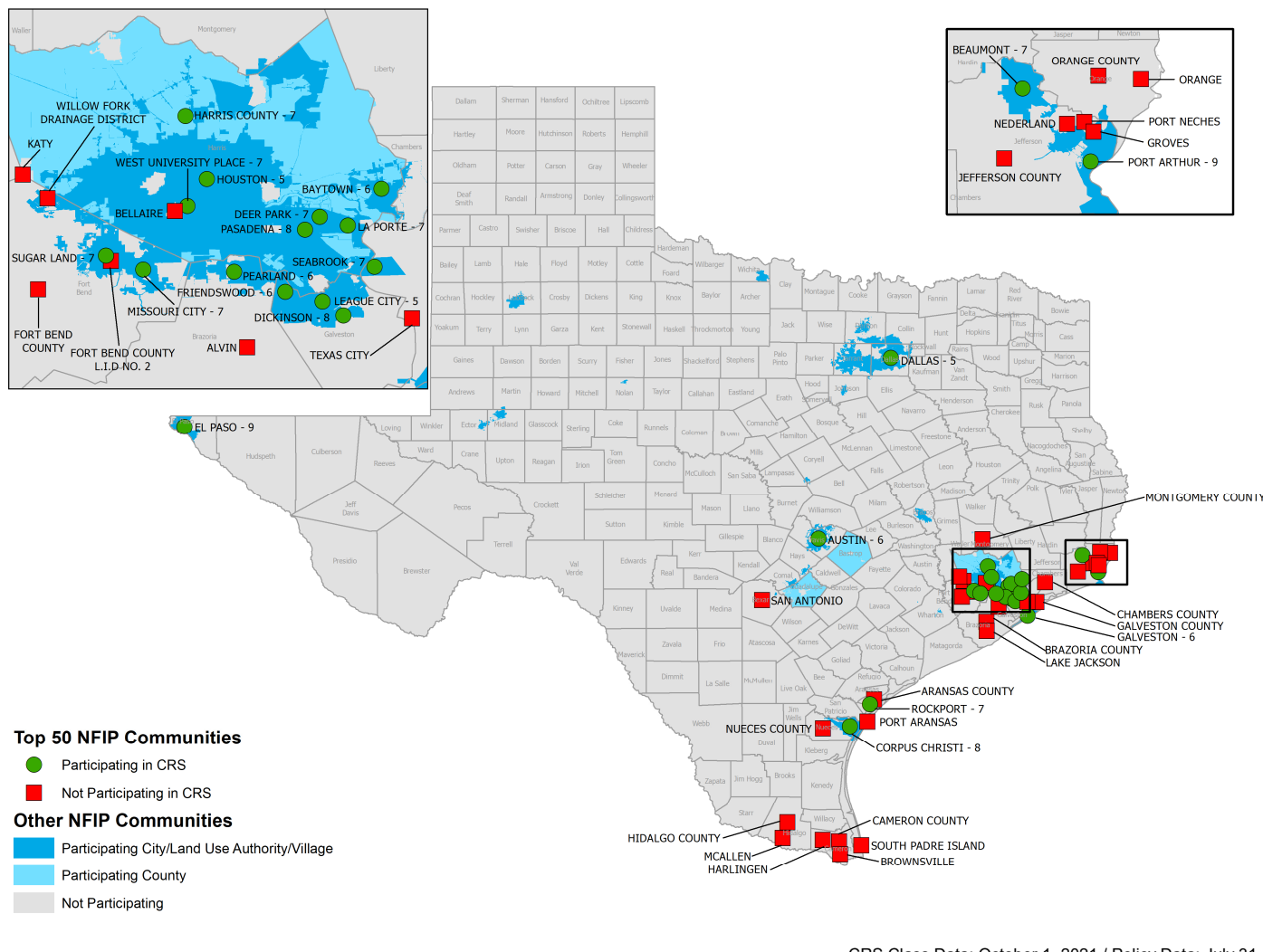

As of July 2021, 1260 communities in Texas participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Of these communities, 66 (or 5%) participate in the Community Rating System (CRS). Of the top 50 Texas communities (in terms of flood insurance policies-in-force), 22 participate in the CRS. The remaining 28 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.



**Benefits of Joining the CRS**

- \* Activities credited by the CRS provide direct benefits to the community, including enhanced public safety, reduction in flood damage, and environmental protection.
- \* Residents know the community is working to protect them from flood losses.
- \* Public information activities will build a knowledgeable constituency interested in supporting and improving flood protection measures.
- \* Money stays in the community instead of being spent on insurance premiums.
