Dear Ms. Spiegel:

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with the results of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) field verification findings based on your 5-year cycle verification. The field verification report is enclosed for your records.

Congratulations! The Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), has determined that the City of Davenport will increase to a Class 7 in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS). The floodplain management activities implemented by your community qualify it for a 15 percent discount on flood insurance premiums for NFIP policies issued or renewed in Special Flood Hazard Areas on or after October 1, 2020. This savings is a tangible result of the flood mitigation activities your community implements to protect lives and reduce property damage.

Please note that Preferred Risk Policies, applicable in Zones B, C, and X on your community's NFIP Flood Insurance Rate Map, are not eligible for the CRS discount. Standard rated flood insurance policies in Zones B, C, X, D, AR, and A99 are limited to a CRS discount of 10 percent in Class 1–6 communities and 5 percent in Class 7–9 communities. The rates for the above-mentioned policies already reflect significant premium reductions.

The CRS rating for your community will automatically be renewed annually as long as there are no NFIP noncompliance actions, so a notification letter will not be sent every year. This annual renewal will take place as long as your community continues to implement the CRS activities you certify in your annual recertification documentation. If no additional modifications or new CRS activities are added, the next verification visit for your community will be in accordance with its established 5-year cycle. In the interim, FEMA will periodically send the *NFIP/CRS Update* newsletter and other notices to your CRS Coordinator to keep your community informed.

I commend you on your community actions and your determination to lead your community to be more disaster resistant. This commitment enhances public safety, property protection, and protects the natural functions of floodplains, and reduces flood insurance premiums.

This Verification Report is provided to explain the recommendations of Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO) to DHS/FEMA concerning credits under the Community Rating System (CRS) for the above named community. The modified activity elements are shown in bold text within the activity statement.

A total of 65 credit points are verified for this modification. Along with the 1496 points previously verified, the community now has a total of 1561 credit points. This modification results in a recommendation that the community improve from a CRS Class 8 to a CRS Class 7. The following is a summary of our findings based on the submitted modification with the total modified points noted in parenthesis:

<u>Activity 310 – Elevation Certificates:</u> The Community Planning and Economic Development Department maintains elevation certificates for new and substantially improved buildings. Copies of elevation certificates are made available upon request. (points)

Activity 320 – Map Information Service: Credit is provided for furnishing inquirers with basic flood zone information from the community's latest Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). Credit is also provided for the community furnishing additional FIRM information, and historical flood information. The service is publicized annually and records are maintained. (points)

<u>Activity 330 – Outreach Projects:</u> Credit is provided for informational material that include flood information brochures, general outreach projects that include social media efforts and signage, and priority audience messages that include a mailer to the repetitive loss areas. These projects are disseminated annually. **Credit is also provided for having a pre-flood plan for public information.** (250 points)

<u>Activity 340 – Hazard Disclosure:</u> Credit is provided for state regulations requiring disclosure of flood hazards. (points)

<u>Activity 350 – Flood Protection Information:</u> Documents relating to floodplain management are available in the reference section of the Davenport Public Library. Credit is also provided for floodplain information displayed on the community's website. (points)

NFIP #:

<u>Activity 370 – Flood Insurance Promotion:</u> Credit is provided for assessing the community's current level of flood insurance coverage and assessing shortcomings. (15 points)

<u>Activity 420 – Open Space Preservation:</u> Credit is provided for preserving approximately 17 percent of the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) as open space and protecting open space land with deed restrictions. (points)

Activity 430 – Higher Regulatory Standards: Credit is provided for enforcing regulations that require development limitations, foundation protection, cumulative substantial improvement, lower substantial improvement, and local drainage protection. Credit is also provided for the enforcement of building codes, a Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule Classification of 4/4, other higher standards, and regulations administration. (points)

<u>Activity 440 – Flood Data Maintenance:</u> Credit is provided for maintaining and using digitized maps in the day to day management of the floodplain. (points)

<u>Activity 450 – Stormwater Management:</u> The community enforces regulations for stormwater management and soil and erosion control. (points)

<u>Section 502 – Repetitive Loss Category:</u> Based on the updates made to the NFIP Report of Repetitive Losses as of May 31, 2018, the , has 85 repetitive loss properties and is a Category C community for CRS purposes. The community is required to submit either a Repetitive Loss Area Analysis or Floodplain Management Plan. (No credit points are applicable to this section)

Activity 510 – Floodplain Management Planning: Credit is provided for the adoption and implementation of the Scott County Hazard Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, adopted November 21, 2017. A progress report must be submitted on an annual basis. An update to the credited plan will be due by October 1, 2022. (points)

<u>Activity 520 – Acquisition and Relocation</u>: Credit is provided for acquiring and relocating 135 buildings from the community's regulatory floodplain. (points)

<u>Activity 530 – Flood Protection</u>: Credit is provided for 2 buildings that have been flood proofed, elevated or otherwise modified to protect them from flood damage. (points)

Activity 630 – Dams: Credit is provided for a State Dam Safety Program. (points)

<u>Activity 710 – County Growth Adjustment</u>: All credit in the 400 series is multiplied by the growth rate of the county to account for growth pressures. The growth rate for Scott County, IA is 1.06.
